



PEARRL is a Marie Skłodowska-Curie European Training Network offering a comprehensive training program addressing the challenges of developing emerging drug candidates into new licensed medicines with innovative drug formulation strategies and *in vitro* and *in silico* development tools tailored to facilitate earlier access to medicines.



PEARRL brings together European pharmaceutical industry, academia and regulatory agency partners together as a multi-sectorial team to deliver a unique research and training programme for 15 Early Stage Researchers (ESR).

The main research objectives of the PEARRL programme are to develop novel bio-enabling formulations and new biopharmaceutics tools to predict their *in vivo* performance as a means to improve efficiency and cost competitiveness in drug development, thus facilitating earlier access of patients to “breakthrough therapies”. PEARRL will create innovation in all three areas (bio-enabling formulations for oral administration, biopharmaceutics tools and patient-tailored PBPK models) to ensure streamlined molecule-to-market time-lines for poorly soluble drugs and thus ensure the future competitiveness of Europe’s Pharma industry. Outcomes will benefit the Pharma industry and, in particular, our industry partners. PEARRL interactions will facilitate collaboration with and among regulatory bodies, including our Partner Organisations EMA, HRPA, BfArM and MHRA, and our joint research will further strengthen Europe’s excellence in academic science at our Universities.

We hope this network-wide training event will be a rewarding experience for all those attending the meeting and a first step in a successful career for the Early Stage Researchers.

About Frankfurt

Glistening with glass, steel and concrete skyscrapers, Frankfurt am Main is the focal point of the greater Frankfurt Rhine-Main metropolitan area, with 770,000 residents in Frankfurt and almost 6 million in the region. "Mainhattan", as it is referred to by some, is home to one of the world's largest stock exchanges and the headquarters for the European Central Bank. The city has existed as a trading centre for centuries and hosts some of the world's most important trade shows including the Frankfurt Auto Show, Achema and the Frankfurt Book Fair.

Amongst the skyscrapers, which are unique to Frankfurt in Europe, are the half-timbered buildings clustered in the quaint medieval "Altstadt" (old town). During World War 2, 90% of all buildings in Frankfurt were reduced to rubble by Allied bombing, with only 5 buildings surviving from the middle ages intact. Restoration of the historical city has been ongoing with the latest project reconstructing the old town quarter between the Römerberg square and the Frankfurt Cathedral (Dom-Römer-Project) penned for completion in late 2018.

Frankfurt has also earned a national reputation as a city of the arts, given its large variety of museums and galleries numbering approximately 60 centres in total. One of the city's most famous literary sons is Johann Wolfgang von Goethe, born in 1748 and after whom the Goethe University was named.

The University was founded in 1914, and currently has approximately 46,000 students distributed across the four main campuses within the city. Pharmacy was originally based at the central Bockenheim Campus but was relocated to the current location in Riedberg in 1994. The 2nd PEARRL Annual Meeting will be held both in central Frankfurt at the *Westend* Campus and at the *Riedberg* Campus located at northern boundary of the city.




How to get to Conference Location Campus Westend and Campus Riedberg




